RICHARD S. DICKMAN

Dick, as he is known among Stoughtonites, was born in Delavan, WI on Jan. 19, 1935.

Dick received his early education in the Delavan School System, K-12, graduating from Delavan High School. When he was 18 years old, he went to the county seat in Walworth County and volunteered for the draft, enlisting in the US Army on September 23, 1953.

He received his Basic Training at Camp Rucker, Alabama where he was stationed for approximately eight weeks. During basic, Dick was injured in physical training and was hospitalized with a knee injury. He was offered a medical discharge, but he refused and was given a physical profile to remain in camp, but with very limited activity such as no kneeling, no crawling, and no jumping. He was very limited as to basic requirements for the entire two-year period of his service.

He was then assigned as a Troop Information and Education NCO (Non-Commissioned Officer.) His responsibilities included lecturing to the company dealing with military protocol. This was Dick's first teaching experience during this two-year period of duty, first I at Camp Rucker and then also in Ft. Benning, GA.

One of Dick's most memorable experiences was teaching very young adults how to prepare for Army life. Most were attentive and willing to learn this new and different lifestyle. For Dick, this was a very enjoyable and rewarding experience.

After Dick had volunteered for the draft and after being call to duty in August, the Korean War had ended, so Dick missed serving during wartime. His highest rank was Specialist-3 Infantry. After being honorably discharged in September 1955 from Ft. Benning, Dick enrolled at LaCrosse State Teachers College and spent four years there, graduating in 1959. After receiving his college degree, he signed a teaching contract with the Madison Public Schools and continued his teaching profession for five years. He then became an elementary principal with in Madison. He retired from teaching profession after 30 years of service.

In 1971 Dick suffered a mild heart attack and then a major one in 1993. He received a pacemaker, which he had very good luck with and it has allowed him to lead a very active life.

In 1957, Dick married Eileen Leary. They have six children and 15 grandchildren. Some of them live out-of-state.

Dick has been a member of American Legion Post 59 for five years.

He is proud to have served his country in the US Army!


